The Council have now confirmed that barriers will be erected in suitable places to stop this happening, hopefully within the next ten weeks.

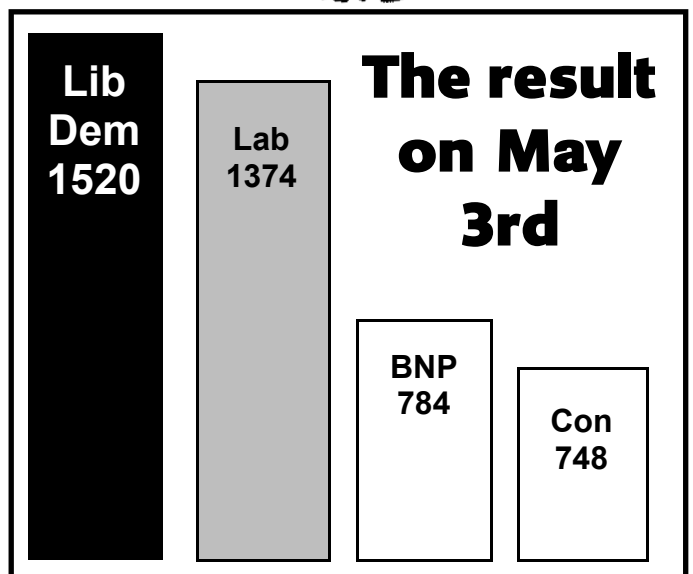
Re-cycling problems
