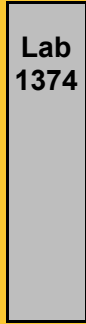

## Lib Dems win £100,000 for Windhill & Wrose

### Re-cycling in Windhill

Only 20% of residents in Windhill use the Council's recycling service for paper, cans, glass and garden waste.


John is campaigning to help people recycle more. He wants paper collection bins for blocks of flats and a way to help people who have to drag their wheelie bins up and down steps.

Details of how you can recycle are included in a leaflet with this Focus and you can apply for a paper bin or an insert using the cut-off slip on the back of Focus

The Liberal Democrats on the Council have secured £100,000 for every ward in Bradford District to be spent on community projects.

Following the recent elections the Liberal Democrats agreed a work programme with the Conservatives. This included plans for making the best use of the Council's share of the money from the sale of Leeds/Bradford airport.

- ➔ Your Labour councillors did not support the sale of the airport.
- ➔ Labour refused to take part in discussions about the workplan
- ➔ They refused to join a three-party Executive to run the Council.

 If it had been up to your Labour councillors, this money would not be available for Windhill & Wrose

One of our priorities is to give some of the airport money back directly to the community through a £100,000 fund for each ward.

## Patches in Thackley Old Road

## Hollin Terrace

A resident came to see John's surgery about the wall which separates **Hollin Terrace** and **Rochester Street** this wall was in need of repair.

John contacted Shipley Community Housing Trust who responded quickly to repair the wall.



## Lang Lane

**Lang Lane**, behind **Bolton Hall Road**, had become overgrown and residents asked John to get it cleared. Although not strictly the Council's responsibility because it was an unadopted road John persuaded the council to do a one off clear up. John is now working to make sure it stays clear.
